### **JUNO Award Nominee Corb Lund Helps UNICEF in its Fight Against AIDS**

Corb Lund is nominated for the 2008 JUNO award in the category of "Roots & Traditional Album of the Year: Solo".

UNICEF Team Canada is the national equestrian skill-at-arms team, and represents Canada in international equestrian competitions. The team won three gold medals and one bronze out of the four team disciplines at the 2008 International Championships.



Off the field of competition, UNICEF Team Canada works to raise funds and mobilize public support for UNICEF's Unite for Children. Unite against AIDS campaign. The team is focusing its efforts in India, and will play "Horse Soldier! Horse Soldier!" as its theme song at competitions and at public events throughout 2008.

There are 2.5 million people living with HIV and AIDS in India. Fifty percent of new infections are amongst young people between 15 and 24 years old. Women account for 38 percent of new infections, a trend with serious implications as more HIV-positive mothers may unknowingly pass the virus on to their children.
